Yes, both Muslims and Christians agree that the Messiah is biologically the son of Mary. This makes him the only human being in human history who is born from a virgin unlike the way billions of people have been conceived since the creation of the world.

#### Miraculous Birth



He was born into this earth like no other.

He was not created like Adam and Eve, nor was he born from a fertilised egg like all other humans since the beginning of history. Doesn't this unique person, Isa son of Mary, deserve our deep thoughts? His birth is an unprecedented event in history. It must be a highly significant and purposeful event.

## **Perfect Sinlessness**

He lived completely free of sin and evil. He never sinned in his entire life. "All have turned away and become worthless" (Psalms 14:3), except him. Even the prophets were smitten by the devil, and constantly asked God for forgiveness, but Jesus (Isa) never asked for forgiveness from God. He even challenged everyone when he said, "Can any of you prove me guilty of sin?" (John 8:46) Who is sin-free except God alone?

## Incredible authority



When the wind blew and the waves bellowed, and the boat was about to sink,.. with authority..

"He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Quiet! Be still!" Then the wind died down and it was completely calm. They were terrified and asked each other, "Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey him!" (Mark 4:39-41)

No one has ever had such authority like this!

The one who fed the multitude -more than 5000 people- with five loaves and two fish..!!



Who healed many sick people, gave sight to the one born blind, and raised people from the dead..!!

Who, with authority, ordered the demons out of tortured people..

And who said to someone, "Friend, your sins are forgiven." The Pharisees and the teachers of the law began thinking to themselves, "Who is this fellow who speaks blasphemy? Who can forgive sins but God alone?" (Luke 5:20-21)

## **Unique Teaching**

He said about himself:

(John 4:14)

"But whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

(John 6:35)

"Then Jesus declared, 'I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty."

(John 6:47-50)

"Very truly I tell you, the one who believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness, yet they died. But here is the bread that comes down from heaven, which anyone may eat and not die."

(John 9:5)

"While I am in the world, I am the light of the world."

(John 14:6)

"Jesus answered, 'I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

(John 11:25)

"Jesus said to her, 'I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die."

Who has ever made these bold claims? Which king or philosopher or prophet has ever said "I am the bread of life", meaning the giver of life, because God alone gives life! Who has ever said, "I am the light of the world", because God alone is the source of light in the heavens and the earth? Who has ever claimed, "I am the truth", and God alone is the absolute truth? Who would dare say "I am the resurrection and the life" except the one who came back to life, and had the authority to declare, "The one who believes in me will live, even though they die" Yes, he alone defeated death and rose triumphantly from the dead. He is the hope of humanity for eternal life after death.

This is also one of the Messiah's thoughtprovoking quotes:

"Your father Abraham rejoiced at the thought of seeing my day; he saw it and was glad." "You are not yet fifty years old," they said to him, "and you have seen Abraham!" "Very truly I tell you," Jesus answered, "before Abraham was born, I am!" At this, they picked up stones to stone him, but Jesus hid himself, slipping away from the temple grounds.' (John 8:56-59)

He exists before Abraham! This means he's everlasting! Who would dare make such a bold claim unless it is true?

It's impossible for anyone to make this claim falsely, because they would only get disapproval, rejection and, in those days, subject themselves to execution. This is exactly what happened to the Messiah. In this incident they considered him a blasphemer and tried to stone him to death.

## **Unique testimonies**

He is the one who said about himself:

"I and the Father are one." (John 10:30)

And when Jesus (Isa) directed the question to the disciples,

"But what about you?" he asked. "Who do you say I am?" Simon Peter [one of the disciples] answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." Jesus replied, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, for this was not revealed to you by flesh and blood, but by my Father in heaven. (Matthew 16:15-17)

## Intriguing prophecy

Jesus (Isa) prophesied about his death and resurrection:

"From that time on Jesus began to explain to his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things at the hands of the elders, the chief priests, and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life. Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. "Never, Lord!" he said. "This shall never happen to you!" Jesus turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to me; you do not have in mind the concerns of God, but merely human concerns." (Matthew 16:21-23)

Jesus (Isa) said this prophecy right after Peter's well-known confession that Jesus is "The Messigh, the Son of the living God", Peter wouldn't have imagined that the Messiah, the Son of the living God, would be condemned to die on a cross.. However, this was exactly what Jesus came for and what he had prophesied to his disciples before it took place.. This is what people still don't believe today: How can the person who said. "The Father and I are one" be crucified and die? But this is the exact purpose for which he came. What he said came true. He died on the cross, was buried, and rose from the dead on the third day as he said.. Indeed, his body did not see decay.. He is the one about whom it was written. "I will take you [in death] and raise you to Myself".

"Jesus, knowing that they intended to come and make him king by force, withdrew again to a mountain by himself." (John 6:15)

He willingly went to die a shameful death on the cross to **redeem mankind and be an atonement for the sin** of those who accept him and believe in him.

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16)

## Solid evidence

After he rose from the dead, he appeared to his disciples and followers over and over again so that they would be eyewitnesses to his resurrection. The disciples turned their lives around after the resurrection of Jesus (Isa). They were in a state of depression and disappointment after the Messiah was crucified and buried. They were in hiding, afraid of the Jews, expecting that

it would soon be their turn to get arrested and put to death just like the Messiah, because the Jews wanted to stop this 'heresy' from spreading.

Why then, when they were in such a miserable situation, would they ever make it worse for themselves and come up with a false claim that Jesus rose from the dead? Wouldn't this infuriate the Jews even more and ensure their death?.. If the Messiah hadn't risen from the dead, it would have made sense for his followers to stay in hiding until it all fizzled out, and then for each to go back to his old life.. Yet the Messiah had indeed risen, and his resurrection is what turned his followers' lives around. from hiding in fear to fearlessly proclaiming the message of salvation and redemption that the Messiah offers to everyone, "so that those who believe in him may not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16).. They were a few, but their message reached the ends of the earth.. They didn't muster up an army, make invasions or achieve any personal gain from this -on the contrary- they gave their lives for this message.. Did those people give their lives as martyrs for a lie..???? It is a question

# that needs pondering and a reasonable answer!

Yes, the Messiah has risen, he has risen indeed.. His tomb is empty, and he is the one people await to judge the world in the final judgment..
